NEA Board of Directors Announces 2022 Nominating Committee Appointments:

Each year your cooperative holds an Annual Meeting of the Membership. NEA will host our membership meeting on May 19, 2022 in Lusk, WY., at the Niobrara County Fairgrounds. More information on the Annual Meeting will be posted over the coming months via the newsletter, newspapers, our SmartHub and on social media. We encourage our members to ask questions, stay informed and attend the event in May.

Part of the process for holding an Annual Meeting is the appointment of men and women to a nominating committee, consisting of nine NEA member representatives to accomplish the task of nominating qualified persons to run for election for Niobrara Electric Association's Board Member positions.

Each of NEA's three districts consists of three board members to represent the districts. Terms for board members run for three years. In 2022, the terms limits for Jack Hammond (District 1), Neal Wurdeman (District 2) and David Keener (District 3) will expire.

It is the Nominating Committees' responsibility to submit these individuals, and/or others as their nominations, on behalf of the membership, to run for reelection or election.

Two of the three current board members with expiring terms have chosen to announce to the nominating committee their interest in being nominated for reelection. These individuals may run unopposed. Or, if the nominating committee has other interested and qualified individuals who have stated their intent to also be nominated, may submit them as candidates to run for a position in their respective district(s).

District 1 will have a vacancy, as Jack Hammond will not seek reelection.

Districts a candidate may run in is based on where the candidate's primary residential membership meter is located on our system.
