Grassroots Networking - Your Voice Matters.

We have been talking for a while about the trying times we as your local cooperative and all other energy providers are facing finding the balance between producing renewable, clean energy and keeping that energy reliable and affordable.

Political administrations, both at the federal and state level, are pushing hard for the elimination of coal for use as a fuel source. They have several approaches to attempt to accomplish this, one is trying to impose rules which are unattainable. An example is a rule proposed by the EPA limiting carbon dioxide emissions or requiring the use of carbon capture and sequestration technology which is currently unable to meet the proposed standards. The failure to meet these requirements means fines will be assessed; those costs will likely be passed on to the member which will increase our energy costs at the local level.

This is where the Grassroot networks are a valuable tool. Grassroot networks or campaigns as they are frequently referred to, have been around for many years. Essentially it is a group of local level people who collectively take action to try and influence change on important political issues.

Wyoming Rural Electrical Association (WREA) which NEA is affiliated with, has a Grassroots Network and is encouraging our members to use their voice to help get the messages to the appropriate officials regarding these important issues.
