

## From the General Manager

It is a busy legislative session for the Wyoming Cooperatives. We are following many bills which affect our business both good and bad. One of the most important is House Bill 184 Utilities Point of Consumption Bill sponsored by House District 2 Representative JD Williams. This bill would change state statute to make it illegal to serve electrical load in another's certificated territory without a customer allocation agreement. NEA has struggled with this since 2013 when our first encroachment occurred, we

have lost a significant amount of revenue not only because we are not allowed to serve the load in our territory but through attorney fees and many labor hours spent combating this issue. Representative JD Williams, Director JD Wasserburger, WREA Executive Director Shawn Taylor and I testified on our behalf in front of the Minerals Committee on January 27th to try and get this bill passed. The bill was tabled and referred to the interim so we will continue to monitor the progress and hope to get it approved in the

next session.

A bill we STRONGLY OP-POSE that is not on this list because it was just introduced is HB0325 - Industrial power consumption freedom act <a href="https://wyoleg.gov/2025/">https://wyoleg.gov/2025/</a> Introduced/HB0325.pdf. This allows industrial loads to be served by other entities in our certificated territories.
