The Niobrara Electric Association is proud to take part in the sponsor-ship of Niobrara County High Schools FIRST Robotics team. Rawhide Robotics is a high school aged robotics competition that is called the ultimate Sport for the Mind. High-school student participants call it "the hardest fun you'll ever have." Under strict rules, limited resources, and an intense six-week time limit, Rawhide Robotics students are challenged to design a team "brand," hone teamwork skills, and build and program industrial-size robots to play a difficult field game against like-minded competitors. Examples of the build restrictions are that it can't weigh more than 120 lbs, have a perimeter greater than 120 inches, and stay under the height of 4'6". It's as close to real-world engineering as a student can get.

The robot is currently a part of the physics and robotics classes at NCHS as a project based learning focus. Exposing students to real world problems and solving them with the skills they have learned in the classroom. Rawhide robotics would like to invite local professional mentors to lend their time and talents to guide their team. Niobrara Electric is happy to support our local kids, especially in the fields of robotics, computer science, and automation. Please either hang on to that notice and plan to attend the meeting, or ask around to folks you know that might be coming to Harrison on the 19th and give them your proxy card. If you do the proxy card option, be sure to sign it with the name that your account is in for it to be a valid proxy. I look forward to seeing many of you there. Last year we had a great turnout over in Lusk. I look forward to seeing many of you in Harrison this year. We'll have the usual financial presentation, as well as upcoming projects, updates from our state wide association, and the CEO of Tri State G&T will be there.

We need to be sure to do our best to meet the quorum to have an "official" meeting. We've had a few years where we were close to not making it. How can you help? Watch for you annual meeting notice mailing. If you are attending, bring your own notice with, and ask your neighbors if they are attending, if not, see if you can be their proxy.

If you do not plan to attend, please fill out the proxy card and get it to someone who will be there. Any one member is allowed to be a proxy for up to 5 others if they have the proper proxy cards. This year's meeting doesn't have any contested races, or major issues, but I'd hate to see us get into a situation where we need quorum and can't make it. A few coops in the state have had the issue of not making quorum in past years. We have been close, but never missed. I do want to thank the dedicated members that show up to support the NEA in this business function of your electric coop.

In response to the survey, we've changed up the attendance gifts a bit, it's WREA's 75th anniversary, so we have a cookbook of selected recipes from the WREN magazine, as well as a bill credit for \$20 for each member that is in attendance.

Spring is also on the way, with that means more activity in the pastures and back country. Please keep an eye open when working near NEA lines and poles. Winter brings many stresses to our lines, including ice and wind that can cause insulators, poles, or anchors to break or come loose.
